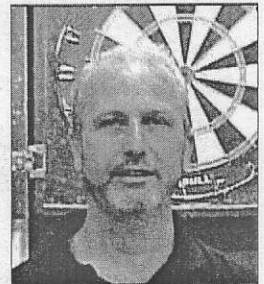
### George Federico claims 2 titles in one night

Another international position was gained by the master himself, George Federico.

Due to the tight schedule the GDA is forced to host several competitions concurrently but that did not stop George claiming them both. Not only did he win the Kronenbourg 1664 singles but he also won the Best of the Rest Singles too.

Some old faces reappeared into the darts scene and other players participated who are returning to form. Included in the mix where Dennis Sheehan, Harry Parody (achieved a 154 outshot) and Jimmy King who reached the final of the Best of the Rest. Just a few of the players who are a most welcome addition to the sport of darts in Gibraltar.

None of the top 8 ranked in Gibraltar can enter the Best of the Rest Singles as they already have positions guaranteed in the Med Cup & World Cup but that does not deter from the quality of darts players that still remain. The winner of the Best of the Rest Singles also gains a place for the World Masters in Bridlington, UK.
